SUCCESS or SUFFERING?

There is a message within Christianity promoted by certain leaders, television preachers, and pop Christian books, that could be summarized like this:

Christianity is intended to lead people to success. That, they say, is the real attraction of the Christian faith. If a religion is to be of any value, it ought to make me a better person, improve my health, reduce my stress, diminish my troubles, enhance my financial condition, boost my popularity, and generally satisfy my felt needs. So this is the way they present Christianity. And, understandably, this is what their listeners have come to seek. After all, success is popular and attractive!

The trouble is, the Lord Jesus does not teach this message. He holds out no promise of such earthly "success" in His kingdom. Instead, our Lord assures His followers that we will find plenty of suffering in Christianity. Jesus repeatedly taught that His disciples will have crosses to bear. "In this world you have tribulation," He said. (John 16:33)

The truth is, suffering is as common and prominent in the lives of Christ's followers as it was in Christ Himself! Our Lord Jesus suffered immensely throughout His earthly ministry, especially in His holy passion, culminating in His bitter anguish on the cross. We who are united to Christ by means of Holy Baptism are therefore united to His suffering. We are "co-heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him." (Romans 8:17)

As heavy and painful as Christ's sufferings were, however, God brought about great good from them! The suffering and death of Jesus earned our forgiveness and salvation! This is why the theme of our Lenten midweek services this year is "Jesus, King of Suffering, King of Salvation." Jesus is the King who was in full control of His sufferings, and consciously working for our salvation.

Moreover, the sufferings of Christ led to His glorification. Because Jesus humbled Himself to death on a cross, His Father exalted Him to the highest place, giving this Man authority over the whole universe! Christ the Crucified, the Suffering Savior, is seated at the right hand of God the Father Almighty, with full dominion over all things.

As people who are baptized into Christ, our lives are in certain respects parallel to His. We too bear our share of sufferings – certainly not as burdensome as what our Savior endured – yet plenty difficult and painful at times, nonetheless. And as God did with Jesus' sufferings, so He does with ours. He brings about good from them! God uses our sufferings as occasions to bless us, drawing us closer to Christ for the strengthening of our faith, and giving us opportunity to bear witness to the Lord's mercy and faithfulness.

As followers of Jesus, therefore, we do not seek to avoid suffering at all cost in a vain search for worldly success. As we sing in the beloved hymn, we "shun not suffering, shame, or loss," but "learn of Him to bear the cross." For God assures us His grace is sufficient to see us through our suffering, and that He will do His good and gracious work in the very midst of our suffering. (See 2 Corinthians 12:9-10)

And finally, we know that all of us who share in Christ's sufferings will eventually share in His glory. We too will have an exaltation in heaven! "We suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together with Him." (Romans 8:17) And no earthly "success" can come close to matching that!

Let this be our prayer, then, in times of suffering:

Almighty and most merciful God, You have appointed us to endure sufferings and death with our Lord Jesus Christ before we enter with Him into eternal glory. Grant us grace at all times to subject ourselves to Your holy will, and to continue steadfast in the true faith unto the end of our lives, and at all times to find peace and joy in the blessed hope of the resurrection of the dead and the glory of the world to come; through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen.
