JESUS' SAVING CARE INCLUDES HEALING FOR OUR BODIES

The appointed Gospel reading for the first Sunday of this month, February 3, is Luke 4:31-44, which gives a nice overview of the work of Jesus' Galilean ministry. It tells how our Lord was active in teaching and preaching, driving out demons, and healing. As you read this passage you can rather easily observe an interesting structure in the order of the events described:

teaching in the synagogue of Capernaum in Galilee, driving out a demon from a man in the synagogue, healing Peter's mother-in-law, healing more people, driving out more demons, and preaching in the synagogues of Galilee.

At the center of this structure is Jesus' healing care. Jesus' work of healing was and remains an important part of His saving ministry. It is a powerful and gracious demonstration that He loves us and cares about us as whole people, body and soul. Our Lord made us as bodily creatures endowed with a soul. We presently are, and we will live into eternity, as people consisting both of visible flesh-and-bone bodies and invisible souls. We are not living and complete human beings unless we have both body and soul.

Man's fall into sin has disastrous effects for us as whole people. It has thoroughly corrupted our souls, leaving them spiritually dead and without the right knowledge of God. It has brought disease and death to our bodies. This is why our Lord, in His great love, came to save us as whole people, body and soul.

Jesus came and showed His care for people in teaching and preaching, driving out demons, and bodily healing – work He continues to this day. Our Lord proclaimed and proclaims in His teaching and preaching the release (forgiveness) from sin's guilt and punishment and control by His atoning death on the cross and His resurrection from the dead. He drove out and drives out demons from those who are bodily possessed or otherwise oppressed by them, granting release from their harm and control. He healed and heals people

who are ill, injured, disabled, or otherwise afflicted in body, releasing them from much pain and physical damage. By all this care our Lord Jesus helped and helps people in the needs of this life.

By all this care our Lord Jesus also showed and shows a preview of the full restoration He will bring about for us in body and soul for the life of the world to come! Once Jesus appears on the Last Day, raises the dead, and transforms His believers to glorious immortality, we will be completely restored in body and soul! Our souls will be sinless, and we will know God as rightly and fully as He can be known. All demons will be driven away and forever subdued and confined in hell, never to harm anyone again. Our bodies will be glorified to an immortal and incorruptible condition, fully and permanently healed! Our restoration in body and soul will be complete and everlasting!

So we praise our Lord Jesus for all His saving care, including healing for our bodies. Our trust and hope are in Him alone as our complete Savior!

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY January 14, 2019

President Ron Reising called the meeting to order. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop was not in attendance as he is attending the theological Symposia at Fort Wayne, Indiana. President Reising opened with prayer.

A motion by Randy Couch, seconded by Tom Ivey was made to approve the December 2018 Parish Report - motion carried.

A motion was made by Dave Kesselmayer, seconded by Pam Woolsey, was made to approve the December 2018 minutes – motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Daryl Dagit presented the December 2018 Treasurer's Report. Dave Drockelman moved, seconded by Ray Barnes, to approve the December 2018 Treasurer's Report – motion carried.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Dave Kesselmayer thanked all those who assisted with the take down of the Nativity Scene.

The Trustees received a bid for replacing lights in the gym and the stage for \$10,450, including all materials and labor. A motion was made by Dave Kesselmayer, seconded by Ray Barnes, to approve this bid with funds to be used from the Building Fund – motion carried. A motion was made by Tom Ivey, seconded by Howie Proehl, to waive the 30 day hold over requirement to go ahead with the lighting – motion carried.

The Trustees estimated repairs for the parsonage at approximately \$40,000 to \$50,000, of which \$11,000 would not have to be done for someone to move in the house. With not having an immediate need for the parsonage, the Trustees are looking at various options for the parsonage, possibly to keep as a parsonage for later use or sell the home.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Randy Couch reported that there was no news, but thanked Rod Bollinger for his three years of service to the Elders, and welcomed Tom Ivey to the Elders.

<u>Board of Finance</u> – The Board of Finance has not met yet this year.

<u>Board of Christian Education</u> – Jamie Hoover welcomed Tisha Daniels and Leslie Hauk to the Board. Jamie will chair this Board, and Laura Dobbelaire will

be the Secretary and Shana Friedinger will be Treasurer. The anuary meeting will include Bible baseball and sub sandwiches will be served.

Board of Worship – No report.

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – The Board has not met yet this year.

<u>Long Range Planning Committee</u> – No report.

Educational Grant Fund Committee - No report.

- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the kit or any of its contents in plastic bags

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

ONE light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended

TWO or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping

ONE adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*

ONE sturdy comb, remove packaging

ONE metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap.
