FOR ALL THE SAINTS

November greets the Christian church with the observance of All Saints' Day. This celebration has November 1 as its set date, but in our churches it has become customary to observe it the first Sunday in November, which will be November 3 this year. All Saints' Day, also known as All Hallows' Day, is a special opportunity to give praise and thanks to God for His gift of the saints.

But who are the saints? Popular usage gives the impression that the saints are people who did famous and extraordinary deeds, or who were particularly "good and religious," or something like that. But this is not the way God uses the word *saint* in the Bible. The Scripture definition is simply "a holy person." So the saints are all God's holy people – ordinary Christians - people who are holy by the forgiveness of sins, and in whom God is working to live holy lives. (You can see examples of the usage of *saint* in Acts 26:10, Philippians 1:1, Revelation 19:8, and many more passages in the Bible.)

It is good and beneficial for us Christians to have a special day to remember the saints and thank God for them. Our **Augsburg Confession**, which declares the official doctrine of the Lutheran Church, states at Article XXI:

It is also taught among us that saints should be kept in remembrance, so that our faith may be strengthened when we see what grace they received and how they were sustained by faith. Moreover, their good works are to be an example for us, each of us in his own calling.

We benefit from remembering God's holy people, because when we remember them, we remember how God was gracious to them, and we are encouraged in knowing that God will always be gracious to us, as well. God's saints also "spur us on toward love and good works" (Hebrews 10:24) as they stand as godly examples for us. The good they did teaches us to do likewise.


We benefit from remembering God's holy people, also by contemplating the blessedness the souls of departed saints are enjoying in heaven even now, and even more so, the full blessedness they will enjoy when our Savior comes again to raise their bodies from the dead, and to restore the creation as the new heavens and new earth. For we know, this blessedness is what awaits us, too!

And yet our observance of All Saints' Day should not be a remembrance *only* of those saints whose souls are already in heaven, (even though those already with the Lord comprise by far the great majority of the saints!) Rather, we should give thanks to God also for the saints who are still engaged in the great tribulation – who are still making their way through the vale of tears in this earthly pilgrimage. And that includes us!

For God has declared us His holy people for the sake of Jesus Christ! Because our Savior suffered and died to remove the guilt of all our sins, we are pure and holy in His sight. Before God, we are just as spotless as Abraham, Moses, John, Mary, Peter, Paul, and all the rest! And God is working in us to do good and holy works, with which He is well pleased. All this is to say: we who trust in Jesus Christ really are saints!

So we thank and praise God for *all* the saints, ourselves included – for all who trust in the truly Holy One, our Lord Jesus Christ, for everlasting salvation. Hallelujah!

The Trustees are currently setting up a contractor to plow snow this winter. They are also hiring a company to do a fall check-up on the furnaces and boilers.

There was discussion on the process of following up with members whose church attendance has fallen off. Membership secretary, Tracy Glass, gave a summary of her role and how she has been progressing with the phone calls and letters she has been sending delinquent members.

Then, Mike Nauth made a motion Allison Harley be hired for the position of full-time organist. Howie Proehl seconded the motion. Discussion. A roll-call vote on the motion resulted in a tie. The committee shall reconvene on this issue.
