THANK GOD! FOR WHAT?

The national holiday of Thanksgiving Day falls on November 26 this year. Even though this is, strictly speaking, a civil holiday, many churches have adopted it as a regular part of their religious observance. This is altogether proper, because the purpose for which Thanksgiving Day was established is in full agreement with the Word of God. For it is to be a day of "public thanksgiving and prayer" to the "beneficent Author of all the good that was, that is, or that will be." (from President Washington's Thanksgiving Proclamation) And God commands us to join together in public thanksgiving and prayer to Him. So it is certainly good for us to observe Thanksgiving in the church. We plan to do so at 7:00 p.m. on Thanksgiving Eve.

It is good for us to gather together in thanksgiving to God, even apart from a special day of national thanksgiving, for we always have plenty for which to thank God! Even in an unusual year like this, when the COVID-19 pandemic has brought sickness and death to so many, caused business closures and job losses, disrupted many of our ordinary activities and routines, and brought some degree of inconvenience to nearly everyone – even in this strange year we have great cause for thanksgiving.

Certainly we thank God for His precious gifts of everlasting life and salvation in Jesus Christ, for the Spirit's work in our lives to preserve us in faith and empower us for godly living, and for the certain promise of the resurrection of the body and the life of the world to come. These surely top the list of blessings for which we give thanks to God!

And speaking of the current pandemic, we thank God that He has limited the harm this disease has caused, for it could surely be much, much worse! We thank Him for the fine medical care to which we have access, for the advances in therapeutic care we've seen in the past few months, and for the progress made toward an effective vaccine.

We thank God also for the countless other gifts of His creation, and for all He does to sustain His creation. These blessings were the focus of the original Thanksgiving observances, but all too often today we take

these gifts from God for granted. We live in a land of so much abundance we sometimes think our food and clothing and shelter come to us simply as a matter of natural course. Or we foolishly suppose we obtain these goods by our own hard work and ingenuity. Worse yet, we might even be tempted to think of these gifts – food and housing and medical care – in terms of *rights*, rather than gracious blessings our merciful and generous Creator bestows upon His undeserving creatures.

This should not be. For God is the Source of all our blessings. Holy Scripture repeatedly directs us, both by example and exhortation, to give God the credit for all these blessings, and to thank Him for these gifts. Consider the following passages, which call us to give thanks to God for providing our food and healing and good weather and protection and every other good thing we receive.

"Oh, give thanks to the Lord, for He is good! For His mercy endures forever – ...to Him who gives food to all flesh." *Psalm 136:1, 25*

And (Jesus) took the seven loaves and gave thanks, broke them, and gave them to His disciples to set before them." *Mark* 8:6


"For everything God created is good, and nothing is to be refused if it is received with thanksgiving." *1 Timo-thy 4:4*

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY October 12 2020

Ron Reising called the meeting to order. A quorum was not present so all motions will need to be carried over to the next meeting. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

The September Parish report was provided.

The September meeting minutes were reviewed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Nancy Drockelman presented the September 2020 Treasurer's Report. Nancy indicated that as far as she knew there were no unusual expenses for the month. Dave Drockelman indicated that the government came out with new rulings for the PPP loans. Anything under \$50,000 will be forgiven but paperwork will still need to be filled out. There were no additional questions regarding the Treasurer's Report.

Board of Trustees – Gary Pool reported that he has not heard anything yet from the company that will be performing the tuckpointing on the church. He has a call into them. He is hopeful that this will be completed yet this year. Gary also reported that there have been some leaks in the ladies' rest room. Once again, hopefully these can be rectified this year. There are also roofing repairs that need to be made. Ross Gould reported that there are a number of projects that need to be completed over the long range. Some items that will need to be completed are finishes in the church basement, restrooms in the church basement, the lower kitchen, and the roof over the gymnasium. On average, we will need around \$50,000 a year for maintenance and repairs. The nativity scene will be put up on November 28th. Valerie Ferguson asked if it would be helpful if more money was directed to the Building Fund to handle these repairs and maintenance. If we don't get the funds needed, we will need to borrow money. Nancy suggested talking to Daryl Dagit first. It was also indicated that in years past the Stewardship committee has sent a letter to the congregation informing them of what needs to be done.

Gary Pool asked if we still have people contributing to the East Bluff property and the Educational Fund. Drockelman indicated that most of the contributions to these funds are through estate planning and people might not have updated where they want estate funds to be directed. We are using the money from these funds as collateral for loans. Gary indicated that he has seen letters from the Central Illinois District indicating a shortage of funds and wondered if money could be taken from these funds to help out. Dave Drockelman explained that there are rules for how money from these funds can be distributed. We have made some expenditures from the Educational Fund in the recent past. Bob Oliverius indicated that from his recollection, the funds were set up so that the principal is protected but the interest from these funds does go into the general fund. The individual committees approve payments from the funds.

Dave Kesselmayer has been doing a lot of work at the parsonage and Ross wanted to extend his thanks for Dave's hard work.

Board of Elders – Dave Drockelman reported that the church helped a couple of families as noted in the Parish Report. The board is still working on a process for contacting members who have not been attending. They are getting more organized and are getting close to having their plan. The board has worked on their budget items. The board has also contacted people to be on board for the next year.

<u>Board of Finance</u> – Nancy Drockelman reported that the committee has a meeting on the 29th of October. They need all budgets by then so they can be consolidated.

Board of Christian Education - No report.

Board of Worship - Valerie Ferguson reported that they will be having Sandy Ferguson make an appointment with the piano tuning company. The 2 patriotic banners that were ordered have come in so we will be seeing them on patriotic Sundays. Julie Wagner has photos if people want to see them. We are still going to use one of the old trees along with the Chrismon ornaments in the new addition. The church will be decorated for Christmas on November 28th at 8:00 am. Valerie has let Deanna Bishop know so the guild is aware and they can help with the decorating. The committee's budget is ready to be provided to the Board of Finance. The Sanctuary Choir and the Bell Choir have not been performing during the pandemic but we are still paying the choir directors their monthly salaries. It was discussed that we would continue to pay the salaries for the rest of 2020 but starting in 2021 the salaries would be suspended until the choirs can resume their performances. Valerie talked to Mary Ashbaker and Peggy Patten and they understood the situation.

<u>Board of Evangelism</u> – Pastor reported that the board is meeting tomorrow to discuss planning for Friendship Sunday.

Board of Stewardship – Brian Ford reported that 4 food boxes have been delivered. They have also decided to go back to the old way of delivering boxes. Pick up will be on the third Sunday of the month. If you know of anyone that needs a box, please let the committee know. We will once again be giving college students a \$10 gift card for McDonalds as we

do every year. Addresses for students at college are needed so the cards can be sent. Envelopes for next year have been ordered. The committee is in need of 3 new members. If you know of somebody willing to be on the committee or who would do a good job on the committee, please let the committee know.

<u>Long Range Planning Committee</u> – Randy Couch is considering contacting the committee members to have a meeting.

<u>Educational Grant Fund Committee</u> – No report.

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Constitution By-laws Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Unfinished business</u> – During the last meeting we discussed the issue of parents not meeting the agreed upon contribution amount toward their child's education at Good Shepherd School. Ross Gould indicated that a discussion did take place at the GSLS board meeting. It was agreed that this is a mission outreach situation and the constitution reads that is it 'recommended' that the parents contribute a certain %. The representatives of all 3 churches agreed that pushing parents to meet that % was not something that we wanted to do. Ross also reported that discussion took place as to why we have lost students to St. Josephs school. Their tuition is \$7500 while the tuition for GSLS is \$5000. It was noted that the Catholic diocese has kicked in \$4000 per student so parents only have to pay \$3500. Ross noted that it was hard to compete with that. St. Joseph's has picked up 25 new students while we have lost 10 students. Ron Reising read the actual agreement that the parents sign indicating that they will attend church. It was questioned if this was happening and he noted that this should be checked into. Ross stated that they are going to have further discussions next month.

New business — Pastor announced that discussion took place at the Elders meeting about Christmas Eve services. Normally we have a fairly large turnout. It is felt that we can comfortably seat 85 people in a socially distanced setting. Talk is taking place about adding an additional service on Christmas Eve. The plan would be to have people sign up in advance, indicating which service they will be attending and how many people will be attending. As of right now we would keep the 7:00 service and possibly have a 4:30 service. We have been running anywhere from 2/3 to 3/4 of our normal attendance on Sundays. If we had a deadline early enough and the 2 services are filled up, a third service could be considered but Pastor was not sure that would be needed. We will have Advent services but it was not felt that we are in a position to have the dinner prior to those services.

The meeting was adjourned and Pastor closed with the Lord's Prayer.
