SORROW AND HOPE AS WE ENTER THE NEW YEAR

At the beginning of a new year it is natural and customary for us to look back and look forward. As we do so again this year, it would be helpful for us to consider some thoughts from God's Word recorded in Lamentations 3:19-26.

"Remember my affliction and roaming, the wormwood and the gall. My soul still remembers and sinks within me. This I recall to my mind; therefore I have hope. Through the Lord's steadfast love we are not consumed, because His mercies fail not. They are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness. 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul. 'Therefore I hope in Him!' The Lord is good to those who wait for Him, to the soul who seeks Him. It is good that one should hope and wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord."

Now, as we look back on 2020, we all know there have been plenty of causes for sorrow, much of which was caused by the COVID pandemic. In fact, many people have already said 2020 is a year they wish they could just forget! We are deeply saddened by the many thousands of deaths this sickness has caused and is still causing. We are full of sorrow because many of our St. John's members became ill with this sickness, some of them very seriously so. We are sorrowful because some of us lost dear family members and close friends to the virus.

It saddens us that we missed out on twelve weeks of worship together in the Lord's house during the COVID shutdown. We're sorry that we missed out on so many regular activities and special events we had planned, such as family gatherings, vacations, sports events, concerts, school activities, community festivals, and even things as simple as dining in a restaurant or going to a movie theater.

Besides all the disruption caused by the COVID we have sorrow over the same sorts of troubles and sad events that befall us in any year. We are sorry over the loss of church members who were taken away from us by death. We are full of sorrow over the many troubles that plague our nation and its communities, such as violent crime, abortion, drug abuse, racial tension, bitter political division, moral decline, and so many other serious problems. And we most certainly lament our own sins – the many ways we have offended God and hurt other people by unloving things we said or did, or by neglecting the good we should have done.

All our causes for sorrow enable us to relate to Jeremiah's

lamentations. He was deeply saddened by the horrors of the fall and destruction of Jerusalem, particularly because he knew it had all come about because of the faithlessness, failures, and sins of his own people. He described his bitter affliction in terms of "the wormwood and the gall." His heart was broken in deep sadness.

Despite the profound causes for lamentation, however, Jeremiah still had *hope*! Even though the people deserved the Lord's punishing wrath, He did not utterly destroy them. In His compassion He preserved a remnant of His people and showered them with His loving kindness – mercies that are new every morning and never fail!

Brothers and sisters of St. John's, this is true for all of us, as well. Despite the various causes we have for sorrow, the Lord has been very compassionate to us! Think of just a few of the evidences of His mercy we have seen this past year within the congregation. So far, as of this writing, the Lord has graciously spared us any deaths in the congregation from COVID. He provided for the pure preaching of His forgiving grace through the saving work of Jesus Christ, even during the weeks we were on shutdown. He was present with us and nourished us with His holy Supper. He strengthened ill and home bound members with His Word and Supper. He called souls to heavenly peace and rest when the time was just right. He guided children and adults into the knowledge of the Truth through our Lutheran day school, Sunday School, Confirmation class, and adult Bible classes. He provided for us very generously with ample financial blessings. And of course we could add plenty more to the list.

Christians, the Lord's loving kindness should always fill us with hope! His mercies never fail! We can most certainly rely on the Lord to be faithful and compassionate in 2021. And that is cause for hope! So let's go forward into this new year with the hope our gracious Lord gives us, trusting in His steadfast love. For Jeremiah's words stand forever true: "The Lord is good to those who hope in Him, to the one who seeks Him. It is good to wait quietly for the salvation of the Lord."

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY December 14, 2020

Ron Reising called the meeting to order. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

The November Parish report was reviewed. A motion was made by Nancy Drockelman, seconded by Bob Oliverius, to accept the report. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Julie Wagner, seconded by Dave Kesselmayer, to approve the November meeting minutes. Motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Daryl Dagit presented the treasurer's report. Daryl indicated that he has the paperwork from the bank forgiving the PPP loan so we will not have to repay the money received in the spring through the PPP program. Daryl also indicated that we have paid off the remaining balance on the building improvement loan.

A motion was made by Dave Kesselmayer, seconded by Valerie Ferguson, to accept the November report. Motion passed.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Ross Gould reported that the masonry work is being done and is progressing well. They will not be able to work on the project on colder days. Ross noted that we probably won't get the bill for the work until next year.

Ross also reported that a neighbor, Mr. Williams, who lives by the parsonage is interested in purchasing the property. Ross informed Mr. Williams that we have been in talks over the past year with Steger's and that we had agreed to wait until spring for further discussions. Ross indicated that Steger's will get back in touch with us by February 1st.

Ross reported that the Trustees have gotten bids from other companies for the property insurance on the church. Bids have been received from Church Mutual and Grinnell. Ross will be reviewing the coverage on the current policy with the bids to see if the coverages are comparable. Hopefully he will have a recommendation at the next meeting. It appears our current coverage is substantially lower at 1.5 million than the recommended ISO replacement cost of closer to somewhere around 9 million. Ross noted that there is a lot to work through before making a decision.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Dave Drockelman noted there were no updates other than the Elders continue to do their normal business. We are still in need of a delegate for the Tazewell Circuit forum. We have until January to make a selection. The date for the Circuit Forum might be pushed back, pending a decision on the dates for the CID convention.

<u>Board of Finance</u> – Nancy Drockelman reported that the committee had met in October and discussed paying off the existing loan and what to do with the CD's that we had at Busey Bank for the Educational Fund and the East Bluff Property Fund that were to come due on December 3rd. Busey Bank was offering a very low interest rate. The decision was made to move to the Church Extension Fund. Half of the money in each fund will be put into a 1-year CD and

of the money in each fund will be put into a 1-year CD and the other half into a 2-year CD, both getting a better interest rate than we were offered by Busey Bank. The budget was also discussed.

Board of Christian Education – Jamie Hoover reported that the youth group did help 4 seniors with their yard work in November. The youth group served cookies between services yesterday. Currently, with the help of Deanna Bishop, practice is taking place for the Christmas program.

<u>Board of Worship</u> – Valerie Ferguson reported that they met last week. Six new banners have been purchased; 2 for Trinity Sunday, 2 for Pentecost, and 2 for winter. The pianos have been tuned in time for Christmas. Gift cards were purchased and given to Adam Miller and Allison Harley in thanks for their help with technical and musical support. The old Christmas trees were donated to Goodwill.

Board of Evangelism - No report

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – Barb Theleritis reported that gift cards were purchased and sent to the college students.

<u>Long Range Planning Committee</u> – No report.

Educational Grant Fund Committee - No report.

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – Ross indicated that we are waiting for the rent payment from the farmer who leases the property. Generally, we get the check in January or February.

<u>Constitution By-laws Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Unfinished business</u> – Daryl discussed the budget. As indicated previously, there is no way to forecast tithing so Daryl compiled information from the previous years to get an idea of what expenses and income have been in the past. The General Fund is behind. Nancy Drockelman motioned, seconded by Cheryl Ivey, to accept the budget as shown. Motion passed.

Election of officers – Bob Oliverius motioned, seconded by Dave Drockelman, to close the nominations for office. Motion passed. Dave Drockelman motioned, seconded by Tom Ivey, to accept the slate of officers as is. Motion passed.
