WHERE DO THE WISE MEN BELONG?

This year we will observe the Epiphany of Our Lord on Sunday, January 2. Epiphany begins a new season in the Church Year, immediately following the Christmas season. The Gospel reading for Epiphany is the account of the wise men coming to visit Jesus. Of course, we commonly associate this visit with the Christmas story. The wise men are pictured on Christmas cards, mentioned in Christmas carols, and appear in virtually every Nativity scene. So it raises an interesting question: with the story of the wise men beginning a distinct season, are they really part of Christmas? Where do the wise men properly belong?

Because the wise men (or literally *magi* – scholars from the east) visited the baby Jesus sometime after His birth, possibly several months later, some people would say they aren't truly part of the Christmas story. For the wise men never did visit the manger, but found the Lord Jesus "in the house," as Matthew puts it – whatever house Mary and Joseph and Jesus were staying in at the time. Because of this some would say the wise men do not properly belong in the Nativity scene, or if they must be included, they should be put out at the very edge, as though they were still on the way to Bethlehem, but not there yet.

The historical point these folks make is perfectly Scriptural, and so it is well taken. Yet there are some other important considerations they fail to take into account. First, the story of Christmas entails more than just the events of the night of Jesus' birth. After all, doesn't the Christmas story include the visits of the angels to Mary and Joseph? And those happened months ahead of time.

Second, Nativity scenes aren't intended to give a visual depiction of the mere facts. Rather, they are visual portrayals of the whole story of Christmas, as well as symbolic interpreters of the significance of that story. After all, Nativity scenes normally depict Jesus as a big, robust infant with a glorious halo, ra-

ther than as a tiny, wrinkly newborn. And Mary always looks fresh and radiant, rather than like a journey-wearied, labor-anguished new mother. And did the angel really hover overhead, right in from of the stable's roof, carrying a "Gloria" banner in his hand? And we have no idea how many shepherds there were, or how many and what kind of animals may have been around. The point is, our Nativity scenes don't have photographic accuracy, and they are not intended to.

So why *not* the wise men? For they certainly *are* part of the larger Christmas story. Their arrival in Bethlehem to worship the baby Jesus and to offer Him precious gifts – this signals an important part of the meaning of Christmas: Jesus is the God who is to be worshiped, and the King of all people, including Gentile foreigners. He is the Savior of the whole world! It's no wonder the Eastern church actually celebrates Christmas on January 6, which is the traditional date of Epiphany in the Western church. Their observance identifies the visit of the wise men as "the Christmas of the Gentiles."

So go ahead and leave your Nativity scenes set up at least until Epiphany. And keep on putting those wise men in your Nativity scenes, and not necessarily somewhere out on the fringe either, but right there next to the manger offering Jesus their worship and gifts. That's where they belong. And in those wise men, we see where we belong!


