WHAT SACRIFICE?

The Presentation of Our Lord is a minor festival of the Church Year that falls on February 2. It commemorates Jesus' presentation in the temple in keeping with Old Testament law. Because our Lord was presented on the same day when Mary's time of purification after childbirth was complete, Luke deals with both these events simultaneously. You can read about them in Luke 2:22-24.

According to Old Testament law, a woman was ceremonially unclean for forty days following the birth of a son. When the time of purification was complete, the woman was to bring to the tabernacle (or later, the temple) a lamb for a burnt offering and a turtledove or young pigeon for a sin offering. If the woman was too poor to afford a lamb, she was permitted to substitute another bird for the lamb. The priest then offered these sacrifices to make atonement for her, and she was clean. You can read about this in Leviticus chapter 12.

Luke says Mary sacrificed a pair of birds, which indicates she and Joseph were poor. But even if Mary was not able to bring an ordinary lamb for the sacrifice, she was able to bring an even better sacrifice! For Mary brought to the temple the true Lamb, her Son, Jesus Christ!

Jesus Christ is the fulfillment of the Old Testament burnt offerings. These were sacrificed to the Lord entirely to make atonement for sin, and to express one's entire devotion and commitment to Him. Jesus gave His entire self on the cross as the sacrifice to atone for every sin of every sinner! His death was also the supreme expression of His devotion to the Lord, His complete commitment to His heavenly Father's will. Because Jesus sacrificed Himself as the final and all-sufficient "burnt offering," our sins are forgiven, God's saving will is done, and we are clean!

This supremely valuable sacrifice of Jesus surely moves us to make a sacrifice for Him – to offer our

entire selves to Him in dedicated commitment and thanksgiving. The apostle Paul says just this in Romans 12:1. "I beseech you, therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service."

We sacrifice our entire selves in thankful devotion to the Lord when we commend ourselves wholly to His forgiving mercy for salvation, when we live in Christian godliness in keeping with His will, and when we devote ourselves to serving Him by humble service to one another and generous support of His gospel work.

Thanks be to the Lord, we know what sacrifice He made for us! May the Lord Jesus work in each one of us so that we may pray sincerely:

"From morn to eve my theme shall be Thy mercy's wondrous measure;

To sacrifice myself for Thee shall be my aim and pleasure.

My stream of life shall ever be a current flowing ceaselessly,

Thy constant praise outpouring.

I'll treasure in my memory, O Lord, all Thou hast done for me,

Thy gracious love adoring! Amen." (*The Lutheran Hymnal* 142 v. 4)

HI-LITES OF ST. JOHN'S VOTERS ASSEMBLY January 9, 2024

Mike Nauth called the meeting to order. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

A motion was made by Randy Couch, seconded by Cheryl Ivey, to approve the December Parish Report. Motion carried.

The December meeting minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by Gary Pool, seconded by Julie Wagner, to approve the December meeting minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> – Daryl Dagit presented the December Treasurer's Report. Daryl indicated that we finished in the black for the month of December but had a deficit of a little over \$14,000 for the year.

A motion was made by Tom Ivey, seconded by Ray Barnes, to accept the December Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees – Gary Pool reported that the Trustees have elected their officers for the year with Dave Kesselmayer serving as chairman, Gary Pool as vice-chairman and Steve Kesselmayer as secretary. Other members of the committee are Trent Hoover, Dane Watson, and Brock Benson. Gary indicated that it was nice to have 6 people on the board and thanked Jack Hall and Garrett Kesselmayer for their work serving on the committee these past few years.

Gary also indicated that the Trustees agreed to allow the American Legion Women's Auxiliary to use the church parking lot for fund raising sales on Saturday, June 17th and Saturday, September 9th of this year. The church has received a check from Weyhrich Farms for the 2022 sharecrop in the amount of \$5,077.00. Work on the basement bathroom continues. They are making progress as the plumber has finished as of yesterday. Gary also thanked the Kesselmayer family for assembling and setting up the new nativity scene and manger, which was purchased with funds from the memorial for Pastor Kesselmayer.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Tom Ivey reported that the Elders met yesterday. They continue to work on contacting inactive members. Tom indicated that they have identified at least 50 people who were deceased or had not been to church in years. In addition, Tom indicated that one family received help with their Ameren bill.

Board of Finance – Board has not met yet.

Board of Christian Education – Pastor Bishop thanked Shantel Tackmann and Laura Dobbelaire for their work on the committee as their terms have expired. Pastor noted that since we don't have a committee member who is a teacher at Good Shepherd now, hopefully, since Tisha Daniels is now on the board and is also on the Good Shepherd Board, she can report on school activities. The youth activity for January will be Bible Baseball. Pastor indicated that they will continue to try to get youth from Sand Prairie and Trinity to participate.

<u>Board of Worship</u> – Julie Wagner reported that the board will not have a meeting this month. Instead, they will remove the Christmas decorations from the church on Thursday, January 12th. The committee is also going to purchase new candles to be used for the Christmas Eve service when singing Silent Night. Pastor Bishop added a comment that he heard many nice compliments about the decorations in the church and the nativity scene from people who attended the service for Bernice Mack.


