"HE DESCENDED INTO HELL"

As often as we Christians repeat the Apostles' Creed, we confess of Jesus Christ that "He descended into hell." People sometimes have questions

about this, and understandably so; it's not one of the easier teachings of the Bible. So where does this come from in the Bible, what does it mean, and why was it included in the Creed?

The only direct Scriptural reference to Christ's descent into hell, as far as we are aware, is 1 Peter 3:18-20. It reads: "because even Christ died for sins once for all, a righteous Man in the place of unrighteous ones, that He might present you to God, having been put to death in the body but made alive in the spirit, in which He also went and preached to the spirits in prison, to those who disobeyed long ago when the patience of God was waiting for them in the days of Noah while the ark was being prepared."

As you can see, this passage is not particularly simple, and does not give us many explicit details. It does tell us this much, though: Sometime after Jesus died on the cross and came back to life, He went and preached to the spirits in prison. Since these spirits were the souls of people who disobeyed way back in the days of Noah, that is, who refused to believe and would not repent, their "prison" must refer to hell. That much is clear.

Precisely what it was that Jesus preached to them is not told us. We can only surmise the content of Jesus' preaching. We know from other portions of Scripture (Heb. 9:27, for example) that Jesus did *not* go there to tell them about a "second chance" for their salvation. Given the circumstances, that Jesus had just come back to life from the dead, we presume He would have preached something about that – that His death and resurrection were His triumph over sin, death, and hell, thus confirming their just condemnation and punishment. We simply don't know for sure.

But whatever it was that Christ preached to the spirits in prison, *the very fact that He did it demonstrates His power over hell!* For Jesus alone has done this – descended into hell, preached to the spirits there, *and then came back!* Everyone else who goes to hell goes on a one-way ticket. They stay there, and cannot cross over to the other side. (Luke 16:26) But Jesus went there and came back as He pleased, thus demonstrating His complete mastery over the place! Jesus claimed the same when He asserted, "I have the keys of Death and of Hades." (Rev. 1:18)

This explains why our ancient Christian forefathers considered it important to include "He descended into hell" in the Apostles' Creed. It is strong declaration of our living Lord's victory and power over hell! Because Jesus has full control over hell, we who believe in Him can rest assured that we are *not* going there! It's just as we joyfully sing in the beautiful and vivid poetry of one of our great Easter hymns: "He closed the yawning gates of hell." (TLH 210:4)

Our *Formula of Concord*, which is one of our official Lutheran confessions found in *The Book of Concord*, contains what is perhaps the very best explanation and advice for us Christians concerning Christ's descent into hell. It reads in part:

"This article... cannot be comprehended with our sense and reason, but must be apprehended by faith alone. Therefore it is our unanimous opinion that we should not engage in disputations concerning this article, but believe and teach it in all simplicity....

It is enough to know that Christ went to hell, destroyed hell for all believers, and has redeemed them from the power of death, of the devil, and of the eternal damnation of the hellish jaws. How this took place is something that we should postpone until the other world, where there will be revealed to us not only this point, but many others as well, which our blind reason cannot comprehend in this life, but which we simply accept." *(Formula of Concord, Epitome IX:2,4)*

So rejoice this Easter season in our triumphant Savior Jesus Christ, who descended into hell!

Twenty-three years ago, Frieda and Herman put their estate plan together with their attorney, right when Herman retired. Last month, the Lord called Herman home and now Frieda has an appointment next month to go to the attorney to have her will redrafted. The thought of taking Herman's name out of her will pains her. Yet, she is confident that he lives on in Jesus. She is working through that change.

The second thing she is pondering is that in her last will, it referenced all three of their children. Frederick died as a hero in Afghanistan fifteen years ago. As with Herman, Frieda clings to the resurrection hope in Jesus about Frederick as well.

In recent days, she has been considering that in the past, their estate was to be equally divided in three parts to their three children. Frederick passed without a wife or children. Frieda has a desire to make his share become a personal endowment to offer support to her congregation to assist those going through grief, all to make sure people can find their comfort in Jesus, just as she has. Her congregation is talking about a new Stephens ministry program, part of which will be directly focused on grief care. She wonders if her endowment could pay for her congregation enrolling in that program.

She scheduled an appointment with her LCMS Foundation Gift Planning Counselor for tomorrow to discuss this. For the first time in weeks, she is feeling great energy and joy about her life, working toward this goal.
