#### A MEANINGFUL FATHER'S DAY

On the Third Sunday of June many Americans will observe Father's Day. This holiday, like Mother's Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, etc., is a civic observance and therefore does not find a place in the Church Year. Christian observance, of course, is determined by the life and teachings of our Lord Jesus, not by any secular agenda.

Nevertheless, we Christians are part of our secular society as well as Christ's kingdom. And since Christ has given us freedom with regard to such matters, we are at liberty to observe such days in our homes with our families and friends. And, undoubtedly, many of us will choose to do so.

If we do choose to observe Father's Day, why not make our observance truly meaningful? Why not take some time to reflect seriously on fatherhood? After all, God created fathers and has given instructions concerning fatherhood. If more people would take His teaching to heart, Father's Day could actually benefit more than just our nation's retail and restaurant industries; it could benefit the very fabric of our society! The following considerations from God's Word can guide you in some meaningful reflection for Father's Day.

**Fatherhood comes from God, who** *is* **Father.** To call God our "Father" is not a mere metaphor. It is not a figure of speech, but a reality. We do not call God "Father" simply because in certain respects He reminds us of our human fathers, but because He *is* Father. "Is He not your Father, who bought you, who made you and established you?" (Deut. 32:6) Human fatherhood is derived from God as Father, not vice versa. Human fatherhood is therefore a dim reflection of God's Fatherhood. Sin has greatly obscured this reflection, as we all know both from the Bible and from experience. Yet the origin of fatherhood within the very being of God is still important. From this truth flow two other important truths:

Fathers are to be honored and respected as God's representatives in the family. This, of course, is true also of mothers. The Fourth Commandment is "Honor your father and your mother." (Ex. 20:12) Both parents occupy divinely established and honorable offices. Yet the office of father derives from God's essence in a way that the office of mother does not. As the Father is Head within the community of the Holy Trinity, so human fathers are the head within the communities of their families. Thus, the apostle writes, "Wives, submit to your husbands, as is fitting in the Lord." (Col. 3:18) So both children and wife ought to honor the father of the family.

Fathers ought to reflect the chief attribute of the heavenly Father especially brightly, namely, love. Since fatherhood derives from God the Father, human fathers ought to be like Him to the extent this is possible. Since God's premier attribute is love (1 John 4:8), fathers should be particularly loving, both to their children and wives. "Fathers, do not provoke your children to wrath, but bring them up in the training and admonition of the Lord." (Eph. 6:4) "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for it." (Eph. 5:25) "Husbands, love your wives, and do not behave bitterly toward them." (Col 3:19) "Husbands, in the same way be understanding as you live with your wives, as with a weaker vessel, showing her honor as a co-heir of the grace of life." (1 Pet. 3:7)

Sadly, too many people today neither understand nor pay attention to these Biblical truths. Too many children dishonor their fathers. Too many wives do not live in the God-given ordering of the family, with proper respect toward their husbands. And perhaps worst of all, too many fathers are unloving to both their children and wives, failing to provide for them and sacrifice for them and discipline them and to be the spiritual leaders of their households. Some of them never even marry the mother of their children, or they abandon their wives and children altogether, which greatly harms their families and communities. If only everyone in the land would listen to what God says about this, and honor His Word!

We know most of the world will continue to ignore most of this. But we, the children of God, can and should take His Word concerning fatherhood to heart. By His grace and power, let's listen to our Father, act on His Word, and thereby benefit from it in our families and our whole society. Then Father's Day might actually make a difference!

Mike Nauth called the meeting to order. A quorum was not present so all motions will be carried over to the June meeting. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

The April Parish Report was reviewed.

The April meeting minutes were reviewed.

Treasurer's Report – Rod Bollinger presented the April Treasurer's Report. Rod noted that we made 2 payments to Good Shepherd School during the month of April as it was thought that we were behind in payments. Rod does not believe this to be the case. This is impacting the year-to-date loss that is being reported.

Board of Trustees – Gary Pool reported that there will be a work day at the church on Saturday June, 3<sup>rd</sup> The Trustees are hoping to get some painting and cleaning done. Volunteers are welcome! Gary reported that a group of volunteers came out to the cemetery reported that our insurance on the church had gone up church, we did get a credit applied to the premium. Board of Stewardship – No report.



Twenty-three years ago, Frieda and Herman put their estate plan together with their attorney, right when Herman retired. Last month, the Lord called Herman home and now Frieda has an appointment next month to go to the attorney to have her will redrafted. The thought of taking Herman's name out of her will pains her. Yet, she is confident that he lives on in Jesus. She is working through that change.

The second thing she is pondering is that in her last will, it referenced all three of their children. Frederick died as a hero in Afghanistan fifteen years ago. As with Herman, Frieda clings to the resurrection hope in Jesus about Frederick as well.

In recent days, she has been considering that in the past, their estate was to be equally divided in three parts to their three children. Frederick passed without a wife or children.
