III. Lutherans believe that we are saved by God's grace alone.

It is distinctive of Lutherans to understand that God saves us sinners by His grace alone. By "grace" we mean His character of love and favor toward us, which we do not deserve.

Our Lord Jesus taught this plainly in His parable of the unmerciful servant. A servant owed his king a huge debt, "and out of pity for him the lord of that servant released him and forgave him the debt." *Matthew 18:27* The king's pity points us to God's grace; He forgives us purely out of His compassion for us debtors.

Peter said of the Gentiles, "But we believe that we shall be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus, just as they were." *Acts 15:11* Paul wrote these famous words to the Ephesians: "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." *2:8* He also wrote, "They are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus. *Romans 3:24*

Martin Luther stated it like this: "Grace consists in this, that God is merciful to us, shows Himself gracious for the sake of the Lord Christ, forgives all sins, and will not impute them unto us for eternal death. This is grace: the forgiveness of sins for the sake of the Lord Christ, the covering up of all sins."

Because of these and many other clear passages of Scripture, we Lutherans declare in our Confessions: "It is taught among us that we... receive forgiveness of sin and become righteous before God by grace, for Christ's sake, through faith, when we believe that Christ suffered for us and that for His sake our sin is forgiven and righteousness and eternal life are given to us." *Augsburg Confession IV:1-2*

We also confess in the Smalcald Articles: "The whole man, in respect both of his person and of his works, shall be accounted and shall be righteous and holy through the pure grace and mercy which have been poured out upon us so abundantly in Christ." XIII:2

You understand, then why *sola gratia* – grace alone – is one of the hallmarks of Reformation doctrine. God clearly teaches us in the Bible that He has saved us by His pure mercy and compassion in Christ – by His grace alone! His wonderful doctrine assures us our salvation is secure, and gives all the glory to our gracious Savior God!

ST. JOHNS'S LUTHERAN CHURCH VOTERS ASSEMBLY MINUTES April 8, 2024

Mike Nauth called the meeting to order. A quorum was not present so all motions will be held over until next month's meeting. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

The March Parish Report was reviewed.

The March meeting minutes were reviewed.

Treasurer's Report – Rod Bollinger presented the March Treasurer's Report. March was a strong month for contributions. Income for the month was \$35,727.50 with expenses of \$24,065.57. While the report shows that our deficit has been reduced to less than \$1,000, it was noted that the payment to Good Shepherd Lutheran School did not appear on the check register so that will alter the financial numbers shown on the report to a deficit of approximately \$9,000.00. The Cat stock in the East Bluff Property Fund has jumped significantly during the first quarter of the year. Of the items on the check register the only non-ordinary payment was for plumbing work at Ewe's Home Furnishings.

Board of Trustees – Dave Kesselmayer reported that in the early 2000's the church received a bequeath from the Fornoff family. The family has found out that there are additional assets and have asked the church to sign release papers for the bequeath. Dave is unsure whether this will further benefit the church. The Trustees have signed a contract with Stratus for \$325.00 a month for a 3-year contract covering 3 phone lines and internet service with a bandwidth increase to 500MB. The Trustees will have a work day on April 20th. One item being handled is anchoring down the pews in the chapel. The water lines have been fixed at Ewe's Home Furnishings. The walls in the restrooms have been repaired and painted. New flooring will be installed. The plumbers will then reset the fixtures. An outside faucet has also been added. The rummage sale was a huge success! \$9,246.05 has been raised to cover the purchase of the tables and chairs. This is enough to purchase the tables and chairs. The Trustees would also like to use \$400.00 of the proceeds for new mulch for the church. The remainder will be going into the building fund for future remodeling. There are issues with the timer that controls the lights on the flag and display case. The Trustees are going to have an electrician install an electric eye instead. It was inquired if the old tables and chairs will be sold. There is a sign-up sheet on the bulletin board in the gym if you are interested in either. The Trustees will decide what they will do with the old tables. Mike Nauth also thanked everyone involved with donating, setting up and working at the sale.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Ross Gould reported that the Elders helped a family with an utility payment.

The church is looking at having a pot luck dinner on May 19th. Ross indicated that in the future there will be a survey included in the bulletin regarding the capital campaign proposed for Good Shepherd Lutheran School. This will help reach people that the school does not have regular contact with. The Elders are still reaching out to people to encourage them to come back to church. The Elders are still in need of an additional member for the board.

Board of Finance – Rod reported that Nancy Drockelman has been named chair of the committee. Last month it was reported that the CD's in the Educational Fund and the East Bluff Property fund were coming due this year. Last year these CD's were converted early and will not come due until March of 2025.

Board of Christian Education – No report.

Board of Worship – Julie Wagner reported that the committee met last Thursday. The committee is still looking for another member. An accompanist is still needed for the choir. Julie has not received any response back from inquiries made to Bradley University. It was brought up that there are no altar cloths in the chapel. Jim Lonergan has investigated the cost with the company where we bought the altar cloth for the sanctuary. The committee is also looking into the cost of buying the fabric and appliques that we can apply ourselves. The committee will be handing out carnations on Mother's Day.

Board of Evangelism – Tracy Glass reported that we are planning to host another potluck on Sunday, May 19th. More details will be provided later in the May newsletter and on the St. John's Facebook page. The committee is encouraging individuals to sign up to be greeters at our Sunday morning services. The committee is exploring the feasibility of creating a new church directory with updated photos. There is still a position open on the board that they are looking to fill. If anyone is interested, please let the board know.

<u>Board of Stewardship</u> – The meeting has been postponed until a later date.

<u>Long Range Planning Committee</u> – No report.

Educational Grant Fund Committee – No report.

<u>East Bluff Property Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Constitution By-laws Committee</u> – No report.

<u>Unfinished business</u> – Mike Nauth reported that there is a position open on the Good Shepherd school board. Someone has expressed interest in serving and there may be another possible candidate. This topic will be carried over to the May meeting as there was no quorum tonight.

New business – No new business.
