III. Lutherans believe that we are saved by God's grace alone. Part 3

It is distinctive of Lutherans to confess clearly the Biblical truth that we are saved by God's grace alone. This includes the happy truth that *even*

our conversion to faith in Christ is God's doing, purely by His grace. Faith in Jesus Christ is not an achievement accomplished by man's will or human decision. No one ever became a Christian by making a personal decision to accept Jesus as his Lord and Savior. Rather, saving faith is itself a gift of God, a relationship of trust in Jesus established by the merciful working of the Holy Spirit through the gospel.

Our Lord Jesus said, "No one can come to Me unless the Father who sent Me draws him." *John 6:44* He also told His disciples, "You did not choose Me, but I chose you." *John 15:16* These words hold true for all believers in Jesus. We come to Him only by God the Father's drawing. We are Jesus' disciples only because He chose us as such. This is why John says at the beginning of his Gospel that the children of God are "begotten not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God." 1:13 It is God's act, not ours, that makes us His children.

God does this work according to the plan He has had for us before He even created the world! He already knew He would send Jesus to save the world, that He would cause the good news of this salvation to come to us, and that He would work in us to believe that good news of Jesus. This is why Luke describes the people in Pisidian Antioch who believed in the Lord Jesus in this manner: "And when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and glorified the word of God; and as many as were appointed to eternal life believed." *Acts 13:48* Note that they believed in Jesus because God had already appointed them for this. That is grace alone!

Along those same lines the apostle Paul wrote to the Ephesians: "In love He destined us to be His sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of His will, to the praise of His glorious grace which He freely bestowed on us in the Beloved." 1:5-6 Again we hear how God had already chosen to make people His own dear sons in Jesus Christ, purely by His grace.

Because of what God teaches us in the Bible, we Lutherans confess in our Formula of Concord:

"The Holy Spirit is present with this Word and opens hearts so that, like Lydia in Acts 16:14, they heed it and thus are converted solely through the grace and power of the Holy Spirit, for man's conversion is the Spirit's work alone. Without His grace our 'will and effort,' our planting, sowing, and watering are in vain unless He 'gives the growth.' Christ also states, 'Apart from Me you can do nothing.' In these few words He denies all power to free will and ascribes everything to the grace of God, so that no one might boast in the presence of God." *Epitome II:5-6*

As believers in Jesus Christ, we have every reason to praise God for the gift of saving faith in Him. The Holy Spirit brought us to trust in Jesus, made us children of God, and thus gives us certainty of our salvation. Acts of human will and personal decision are acts of sinners and therefore flawed and uncertain. Acts of God are unfailingly reliable! So for the certainty of our salvation, and to the praise of God's name alone, we joyfully confess that by His grace alone, God brought us to saving faith in Jesus Christ!

President Mike Nauth called the meeting to order. A quorum was present. Pastor Bishop opened with devotions.

A motion by Dave Kesselmayer, seconded by Tom Ivey, was made to approve the March and April 2024 Parish Reports – motion carried. A motion by Randy Couch, seconded by Ross Gould, was made to approve the March and April 2024 minutes - motion carried

Treasurer's Report – Rod Bollinger presented the April 2024 Treasurer's Report and noted that two tuition payments for Good Shepherd Lutheran School were made in April as well as the new tables and chairs that were purchased for the gym from the proceeds of the church rummage sale. A motion was made by Nancy Drockelman, seconded by Tom Ivey, to approve the March and April 2024 Treasurer's Report - motion carried.

<u>Board of Trustees</u> – Dave Kesselmayer reported that the final amount received for the church's rummage sale was \$9,639.05. The tables and chairs are all at the church and cost approximately \$8,000. A motion was made by Dave, seconded by Bob Oliverius, to use \$400 of the remaining \$1,639.05 for the purchase of mulch for the church's flower beds. The Trustees will find storage for the tables and chairs.

Steve Kesselmayer met with Stratus last week and Status will let the Trustees know when they can install new fiber and the Trustees can do their prep work.

The Trustees would like to have the bell tower repaired this fall if the Board of Finance believes it is possible.

<u>Board of Elders</u> – Ross Gould reported that the Elders assisted with three requests for utilities and rent, will be having a pork chop/potluck after second service on Sunday, May 19, and continue reaching out to inactive members.

Board of Finance – No report.

Board of Christian Education – John Neumann reported that the School Board will meet on May 21 to further discuss a capital campaign. If the Board decides to move forward, the Campaign would start in August and run for approximately 20 weeks. GSLS calendar was extended for ½ day to cover a snow day taken previously.

Laura Dobbelaire reported that the activity in May will be to assist seniors with yard work.
