
### **Invocation:**




### The Confession of Sins:


W: I said, I will confess my transgressions unto the Lord







**The Catechism Review – The Sacrament of Holy Baptism** *What is Baptism?* 

Baptism is not just plain water, but it is the water included in God's command and combined with God's word.

Which is that word of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Matthew: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."

What benefits does Baptism give?

It works forgiveness of sins, rescues from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe this, as the words and promises of God declare.

Which are these words and promises of God?

Christ our Lord says in the last chapter of Mark: "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned."

# The Old Testament Reading: Amos 5:6–7, 10–15

<sup>6</sup>Seek the LORD and live,

lest he break out like fire in the house of Joseph, and it devour, with none to quench it for Bethel,

<sup>7</sup>O you who turn justice to wormwood

and cast down righteousness to the earth! . . .

<sup>10</sup>They hate him who reproves in the gate, and they abhor him who speaks the truth.

<sup>11</sup>Therefore because you trample on the poor and you exact taxes of grain from him, you have built houses of hewn stone, but you shall not dwell in them;

you have planted pleasant vineyards,

but you shall not drink their wine.

<sup>12</sup>For I know how many are your transgressions

and how great are your sins—

you who afflict the righteous, who take a bribe,

and turn aside the needy in the gate.

<sup>13</sup>Therefore he who is prudent will keep silent in such a time,

for it is an evil time.

<sup>14</sup>Seek good, and not evil,

that you may live;

and so the LORD, the God of hosts, will be with you,

as you have said.

<sup>15</sup>Hate evil, and love good,

and establish justice in the gate;

it may be that the LORD, the God of hosts,

will be gracious to the remnant of Joseph.

## The Epistle: Hebrews 3:12–19

<sup>12</sup>Take care, brothers, lest there be in any of you an evil, unbelieving heart, leading you to fall away from the living God. <sup>13</sup>But exhort one another every day, as long as it is called "today," that none of you may be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin. <sup>14</sup>For we share in Christ, if indeed we hold our original confidence firm to the end. <sup>15</sup>As it is said,


"Today, if you hear his voice, do not harden your hearts as in the rebellion."


# Holy Gospel: Mark 10:17-22

<sup>17</sup>As [Jesus] was setting out on his journey, a man ran up and knelt before him and asked him, "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" <sup>18</sup>And Jesus said to him, "Why do you call me good? 
